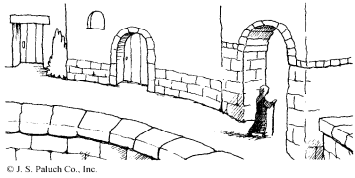

Most Ancient of Traditions: SUNDAY (6)
(Continued from last week's bulletin)

Sunday Assembly

Qahal Yahweh was translated into Greek as *Ikklesia*. This term, which translates as “church,” was used by the followers of Jesus to describe their own community assemblies devoted to prayer, instruction, singing of hymns, breaking of bread, and sharing of cup. Just as in the assemblies of old, God spoke to the people through anointed leaders. During the first generations of Christianity there were apostles, elders, and presbyters. God continues to speak today through bishops, priests, deacons, other specially assigned preachers, and lectors. There is evidence that in some early church communities, God spoke to the people also through extraordinary gifts of prophecy, tongues, and interpretation of tongues by participants under the influence of the Spirit (1 Corinthians 14). God also spoke through sacred writings inherited from the old covenant and through new holy writings passed from assembly to assembly, writings that would become the Christian Scriptures.

When persecution of Christians stopped in the early 4th century, and even earlier during lulls in persecution, it became customary to hold these religious assemblies in a fixed place or building instead of in house-churches of community members. In the Greek language this fixed building was called *Kyriake*, or “(house) belonging to the Lord.” This Greek term appeared in Anglo-Saxon as *circe*, in Germanic tongues as *kirche*, in Middle English as *chirche*, and finally as our church. The term points to the mystery of a holy place, but always first of all to the holy community of believing people who meet there.

Sunday Obligation

For the first three centuries no particular church discipline enforced participation in the Sunday assembly, or Mass. Enthusiastic weekly assembly was motivated by deep devotion to Christ's resurrection and expectation that this Christ would return shortly in glory. This motivation eventually waned. Already in the Letter to the Hebrews, about 96 of the Common or Christian era (C.E.), there is mention of this: “Let us hold unwaveringly to our profession which gives us hope. ...We must consider how to rouse each other to love and good deeds...We should not absent ourselves from the assembly, as some do, but encourage one another; and this all the more because you see the Day draws near” (Hebrews 10:23, 25).

At the beginning of the 4th century in Spain, even the midst of a final persecution of Christians, the Council of Elvira declared that persons were to be excommunicated for a short time if they lived in the area and yet neglected Mass for three Sundays. This tendency to view presence at Sunday mass as a serious matter seems to be connected to an identification of the Christian Sunday with the Jewish Sabbath.

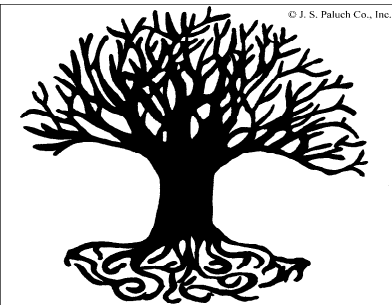

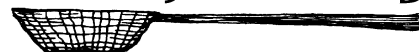

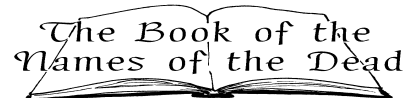
